Camira Fabrics

In regard to end customers, we plan to firm up final details of the 2014 lamb's wool supply contract with Camira Fabrics by the end of this month, with discussion also being held around future years supply, reaffirming Camira's commitment to the integrity credentials of our Laneve® brand.

John Quarmby, Camira's Supplier Development Manager is currently in New Zealand evaluating systems around traceability, scouring, and testing. We will report back to shareholders once the discussions are complete with Camira and there are early indications that we may need to increase the volume of supply at a price of \$6.10/kg.

Market Report


New Zealand Wool Services International reported the following from this week's wool sale:

A 91% clearance on the 6,600 bales on offer on the North Island this week with most types at lower levels than at the previous South Island sale held on the 7 November 2013.

Fine Crossbred Fleece 33 to 35 micron was up to 5% cheaper as was Crossbred Full Fleece 37 micron and Coarser. Finer Crossbred early shorn and second shear types 32 to 35 micron were generally 2.5-5% cheaper while Combing Oddments were 5% down and carding oddment types were par to 2.5% easier.

Principal buyers were China, Australasian Carpet Mills, supported by Western Europe. The next sale on 21 November will comprise 5,890 bales from the South Island.
