# WNZ Laneve Integrity Program EU Eco-Label Compliant Lamb's Wool Contract

If you haven't already done so remember to sign up for the 2015/2016 WNZ Laneve lamb's wool contract **by this Friday 31 July** to ensure you qualify for the 10 c/kg (clean) early bird incentive. We have had a high level of interest in this year's contract, so contact your local SLO and give us your best estimate of supply.

A reminder also that WNZ requires a signed contract to ensure your inclusion in the lamb's wool or any WNZ contract. This is regardless of whether you have filled in a Staple commitment form.

As we have had a number of queries around pesticide requirements for this contract we will be providing some independent advice regarding pesticide use and best practice over the coming weeks.

# Market Report – 23 July 2015

Last week's sale of 6,617 bales saw increases of 1-2% overall. A good result, considering offering of 52% Coarse Crossbred Early Shorn and Second Shear types.

There was good demand for shorter Second Shear types 2-3 inch 32-35 micron as buyers bid to cover Chinese orders. The trade weighted indicator was little changed from the last wool sale on 16 July. Compared to the South Island sale on 16 July Fine Crossbred Early Shorn and Second Shear types 3/5 and 3/4 inch were 1% dearer.

A limited offering of Coarse Crossbred Fleece wools were up 1%. Coarse Crossbred Early Shorn and Second Shear 37-39 micron 3/5 to 2/4 inch were 1% dearer, while 2/3 inch were firm. A nominal offering of Crossbred Combing Oddments were in sellers favour, while good colour Clothing Oddments increased by 2% with poorer colour remaining firm. Next sale on 30 July comprises approximately 8,000 bales from the South Island.
